## Filling Rear Tires with RV Anti-freeze - by John (TR)

I finally bit the bullet and filled the $13.6 \times 28$ rear tires tonight. I installed 34 gallons each tire and it trickled out once while I was removing the fill valve. 34 gallons and not trickle! I thought this would be miserable work but it went pretty easy, instead.

I bought a cheap, drill-driven pump from Menard's and a fill valve from Orscheln's.

I ended up using RV antifreeze, 28 gallons antifreeze and 6 gallons water each side. All on sale @ 2.50/gallon. RV anti-freeze is pet-friendly - pets like to drink regular anti-freeze and it's extremely poisonous and causes a very painful death.

With an empty tire, I was filling 6 gallons between burping the tire but as it filled I was down to 3 gallons or the pump ran very slow.
